She is the original and first Shaker And Mover who made things happen single-handedly and creatively as early as 2004 with her Merci Melchor Brochures for Battered Women (MMBBW) Her work has been featured by the Bantay Bata Foundation and the ABS-CBN News Channel, has been used by some Zonta Clubs, the Sulu Provincial Women's Council, several local and international women's organizations. Then, S.A.M. stood for Stop Abuse Mom.

Iam SAM TAGLINE is...

I am SPECIAL, UNIQUE and PRECIOUS.™

The IamSAM PEP is anchored on its tagline, I Am Special, Unique and Precious. Being Special, Unique and Precious is a natural entitlement. By definition, "natural" means not made or caused by humankind. Simply because you are born into this world, you are naturally, Special, Unique and Precious and so is every single person in the human race or family. "Entitlement" means a guarantee of right to being special, unique and precious.

HOW WE DO IT:

IamSAM PEP (Prevent-to-Empower Protocol) is the flagship program of the foundation. It is grounded on providing a high degree of awareness, consciousness, structured education and options/support for: *preventing any, further and future abuse, while embracing one's own self-worth.*

COMPONENT 1

LEARNING ABOUT UNIVERSAL HUMAN RIGHTS AND DUTIES

Through the PEP, children and women learn to appreciate and exercise human rights and responsibilities, including those most important for women and children :

- Right to full development of the personality
- Freedom of thought and expression
- Right to standard of living adequate for health and well-being
- Entitlement of women and children to special care and assistance
- Freedom from servitude, and cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment

COMPONENT 2

LEARNING ABOUT CHILDREN'S RIGHTS

Through the PEP, children and women* learn to appreciate and exercise children's rights and responsibilities. Among these are the four principles of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Children (UNCRC), adopted in 1989 and ratified by 194 countries:

- Children should not suffer discrimination.
- The best interests of children should be at the top of the agenda when decisions affecting them are being made.
- Children have the right to survive and develop. This includes the right to mental and physical well-being.
- Children should be free to express their views. And these views should be taken into account in all matters that affect them.

COMPONENT 3

LEARNING TO RECOGNIZE AND REJECT CHILD ABUSE (ABUSE 101)

Because child abuse casts a shadow the length of a lifetime (*Herbert Ward*),

Children in the Protocol learn among the following:

- Child abuse or maltreatment constitutes all forms of physical abuse, emotional abuse, sexual abuse, neglect and domestic violence.
- Child abuse has serious physical, psychological, behavioral, and psychosocial consequences which adversely affect their health, well being and future.

COMPONENT 4

LEARNING TO DEVELOP CHILDREN'S SELF-WORTH

Self-worth is the GREATEST TOOL we can give a child. (SAM/ Rayla Melchor Santos).

Because one of the greatest lessons, if not THE greatest lesson a child can learn, is the lesson on self-worth—that s/he is Special, Unique and Precious.


